There were Leisure Centre staff? advising traffic at the entrance from the main road warning of treacherous and dangerous conditions with sheet ice & black ice on the roads, in the car parks and surrounding pavements.

Indeed they were correct. It was very treacherous and dangerous !

Myself and many others were slipping and sliding all over the place.

There was no evidence of gritting and salting having taken place.

Can you clarify what the problem was with the lack of gritting and salting the roads, the car parks and surrounding pavements in the park.

The Centre Staff said they had contacted the Council.

Please clarify the time when the Council were advised about the black ice and the time when the area was eventually gritted and salted.

You will be aware that this lack of gritting and salting has been raised as a problem for the last 5-6 years.

Priority gritting routes

Find out how we prioritise which roads get gritted first.

Our staff work 24 hours on standby during the winter.

We get road updates from a specialist forecasting service at least three times a day. Roadside sensors also send information to help check road conditions.

This helps us decide what action to take.

Roads priority gritting routes

Priority 1

Strategic and main traffic routes

A77 Fenwick Road

A77 Ayr Road

A727 Busby to Spiersbridge

A736 Glasgow Road to Lochlibo Road

B769 Stewarton Road

B767 Busby to Eaglesham

Priority 2

One access route to fire stations

Major bus routes

School bus routes notified by SPT (may not include the full route)

Priority 3

Other B class roads

Priority 4

Local employment areas such as industrial estates

Priority 5

C class roads and unclassified public roads

Priority 6

Access to isolated homes

Priority 7

Prospective public roads

Priority 8

Private roads

During normal winter weather, we grit priority 1 to 3 routes and some priority 4 and 5 routes. We'll grit these routes on first and second runs.

During severe winter weather we may need to concentrate on priority 1 and 2 routes.

We'll grit other routes if the severe weather continues and other priority routes stay clear.

Priority 2

Areas used by many people - such as train station entrances

Priority 3

Steep hills in housing areas, old people's homes and sheltered housing

Priority 4

One pavement along the front of each school

We grit pavements once all priority routes are deemed safe and clear and if we have the resource to do so.
