Three teenagers have been hospitalised after a 'large scale' clash between two groups in a park near Glasgow.

Officers received multiple reports of a disturbance in Rouken Glen Park in East Renfrewshire on Saturday afternoon.

Boys aged 15, 16 and 17 were taken to Queen Elizabeth University Hospital for treatment.

An investigation has been launched into the incident.

Police raced to Rouken Glen Park in East Renfrewshire following "numerous reports" of a "large scale disturbance" in the area.

Three teenagers were rushed to hospital after a rammy at a park near Glasgow.

Police raced to Rouken Glen Park in East Renfrewshire following "numerous reports" of a "large scale disturbance" in the area at around 6.40pm last night.

The incident is said to have involved two groups of youths and a source said they saw "young adults with foil blankets on" near the pond, following the brawl.

Ambulance crews attended and three teenage boys aged 15, 16 and 17 were taken to the Queen Elizabeth University Hospital.

The boys received treatment for injuries and have since been released from the hospital.

Police have launched a probe into the incident and they are asking any witnesses to come forward.
